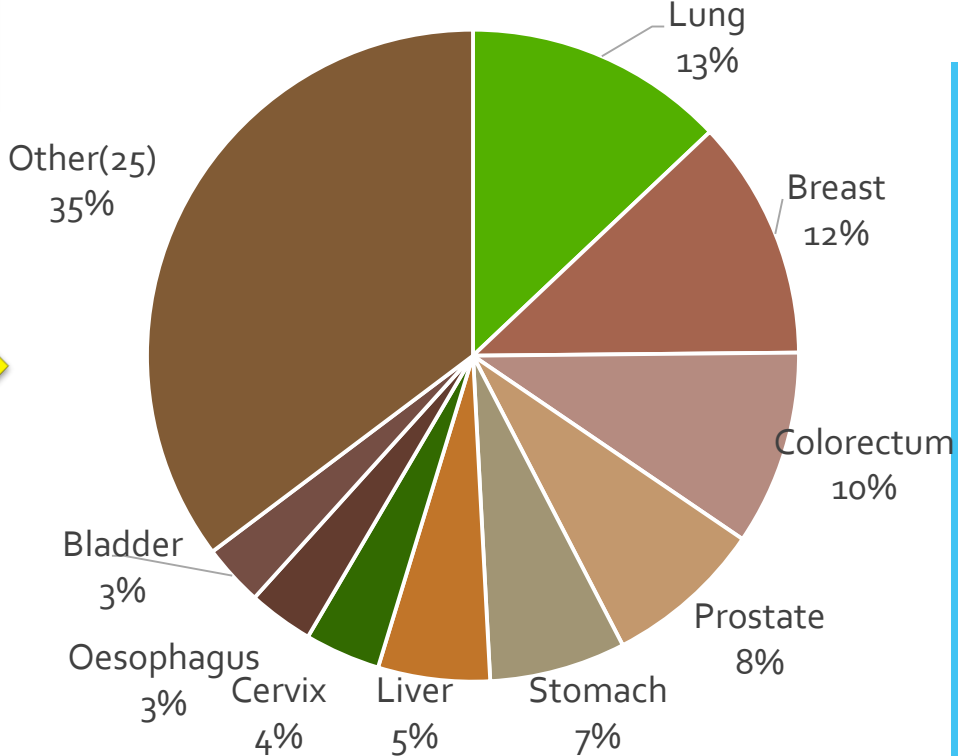

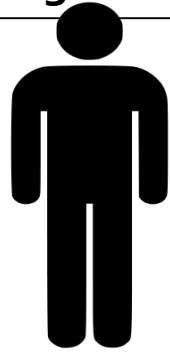

Breast cancer



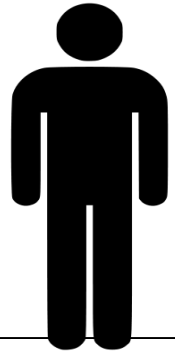

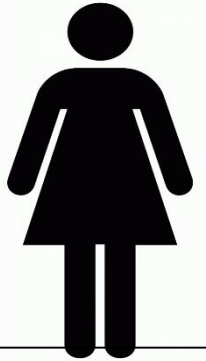

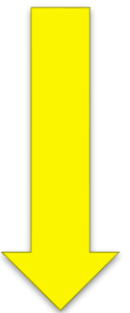
37,000 new cases annually

(5% of Kenya Annual incidence)

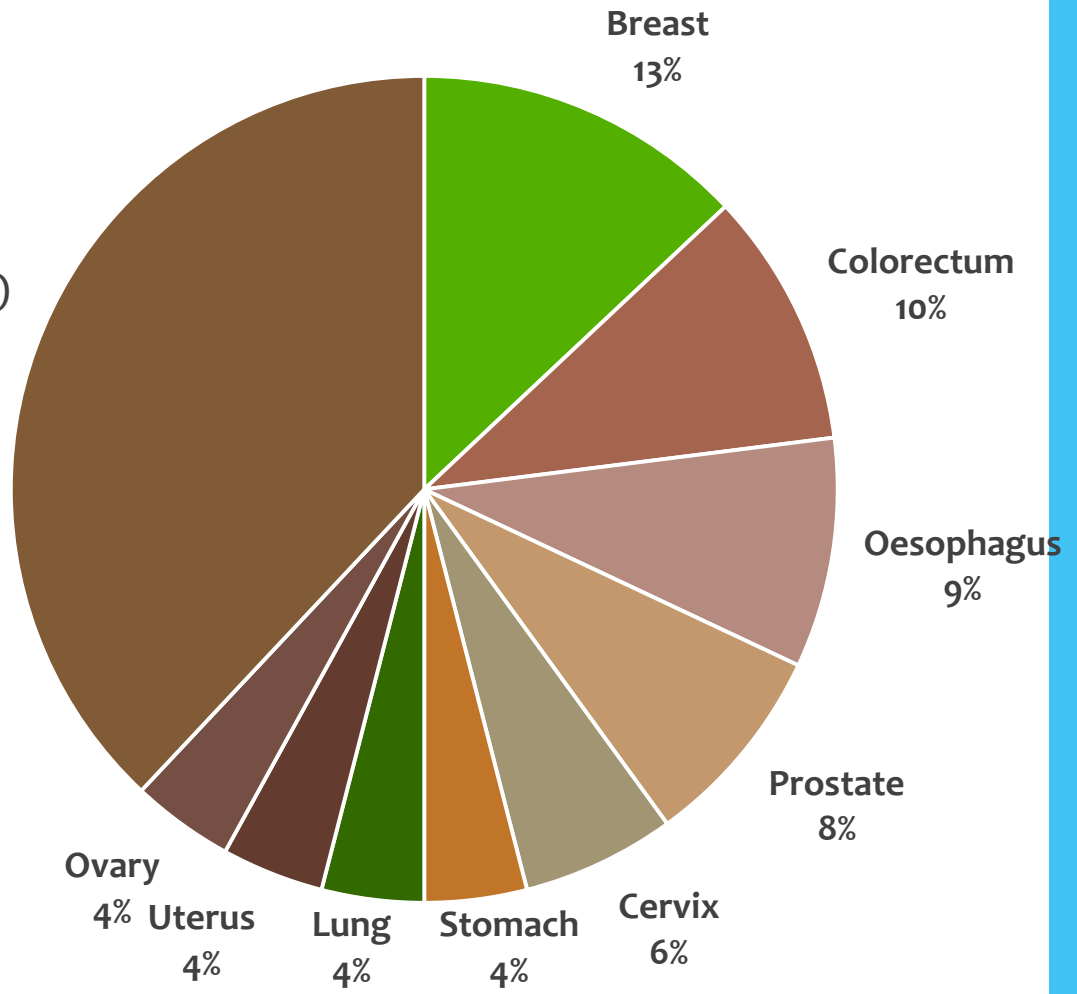

Types



Some of Causes of Cancer

Behavioural causes:

- Tobacco
- Alcohol
- Diet
- Sedentariness

Biological causes:

- Weight
- Infections: Hepatitis B & C, HPV, EPV, HIV, bacteria and parasites

Environmental causes:

- Chemicals; Asbestos, aflatoxins
- Radiation

Genetics

- Gender
- Age

Key Challenges

1. **Limited Government support:** No existing programme or dedicated budget – however the Ministry of health launched the Kenya National Cancer Control Strategy 2017-2022 which is ongoing
2. **Limited NGO support:** very few international NGOs have cancer specific programmes. There is a lot more coverage on HIV, Malaria and other topics
3. **No Insurance cover:** Although there are more than 40 insurance companies in Kenya, there is non with a medical cover that includes cancer. The only exception is the state agency - National Hospital and Insurance Fund (NHIF) that introduced enhanced benefits that included covered cancer in 2015
